North Shore Schools Board of Education Town Meeting Minutes October 22, 2015

The meeting was called to order by President Herman Berliner at 7:30 P.M. in the High School Cafeteria. Present were Trustees Commander, Gonzalez, Jones, Labbate, Nightingale, and Russo. Also present Superintendent Dr. Edward Melnick, and Assistant Superintendents Olivia Buatsi and Robert Chlebicki.

# **Pledge of Allegiance**

President Berliner led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Board Recognition**

On behalf of Coordinating Council, Denise Reiner and Lisa Vizza recognized members of the Board of Education for their dedication to the students and community of the North Shore Schools. The Madrigals performed in their honor and students representing elementary, middle, and high school read pieces they wrote on "what they appreciate most about being a North Shore student" and presented each Board member with flowers.

#### **Student Recognition**

On behalf of the Board of Education, President Berliner and Dr. Melnick recognized Angelo Antinori, for being selected to the All Symphony Orchestra of the All National Honor Ensemble; also recognized were National Merit Semi-Finalists Isabella Alessandrini, Elias Mastakouris, and Diana Vizza; and the 2015 North Shore High School's Summer Reading Celebration Reader Leaders.

#### **SGO Report**

Jessica Hannon, SGO president, reported on events and activities at the high school including, Homecoming this past Saturday was very successful, the football team won their game, and the Pulse dance group and Electra performed. Rehearsals for the fall play "Almost Maine" are underway; flags are up in hallway; students are interested in bringing back the student forum —a place for the student body to come together to discuss current events and issues that affect them. President Berliner offered to assist in securing speakers for these forums.

#### **Town Meeting – Open Format**

President Berliner opened the floor for questions or comments from the audience.

Trustee Russo reminded the public that Danza Cubana is scheduled for Saturday, October 24 @ the American Legion Hall. Tickets are \$25/adults and \$15/students. Tickets are available through the Arts Angels website.

With no comments or questions from the public, the town meeting was concluded.

# **Approval of Minutes**

On motion of Trustee Commander seconded by Trustee Nightingale and all in favor, the minutes of October 8, 2015 were approved.

# Regular Business K-12 Science Program

Mr. Chlebicki gave an overview of the K-12 science program which is currently guided by the math/science state standards developed in 1996. The future New York State standards, Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), were developed by world class scientists and experts in the area of teaching science, with the disciplinary core ideas of physical science, life sciences, earth and space science, and engineering and technology science. New York State has not yet adopted these standards and it is not clear if they will. Ms. Carol Smyth reviewed the K-5 science program; only 4<sup>th</sup> graders take a state assessment. Students have many enrichment opportunities with field experiences, exploring local waterways, garden experiences, interdisciplinary learning and community and home partnerships (Sea Cliff Makeshop). Ms. Amy DiMeola reviewed the middle school science program; 6<sup>th</sup> grade focuses on earth and space science, 7<sup>th</sup> grade focuses on physical sciences, and all 8<sup>th</sup> graders are accelerated and take the Living Environment Regents course. Finally, Mr. Menchel reviewed the high school science program. He focused on the implementation of the IB learning profile into the science courses and the goal of having that learning profile reach all courses with consistency of language and scientific procedure. He explained that the IB philosophy is right in line with the NGSS standards.

Trustee Labbate thanked the administrators for their presentation. She said it is exciting to see how far the science department has come and to see what is planned for the future.

Trustee Russo asked if students who decide not to take the second year of IB Biology would be able to take IB Physics next year and would then be prepared to take the AP Physics exam. She also asked if students would be able to take more than one science next year as well as music. Mr. Cousins responded students will be able to take IB Physics and the AP exam in their senior year, and will have more flexibility in their schedules.

Trustee Jones said it is terrific to hear about the opportunities that our students have, and the NGSS are exciting and robust but seem time consuming. She wondered where we are in trying to meet those standards. Mr. Chlebicki responded we are further along at the elementary and middle school level. He went on to say that one of the sticking points at the state for adopting the standards is at the high school level because they are not science course specific; NGSS takes more of a general approach to all of the sciences. Mr. Menchel added part of the problem is the NGSS clearly defines when things should be taught and as a district we do a good job in teaching all of the standards but it's difficult to dice it up. Mr. Cousins explained NGSS comes through in how we approach scientific thinking rather than which topics are taught in which year. Trustee Jones said she feels we've done a nice job with younger kids in how they think of themselves as readers and writers. Her hope is they will now think of themselves as scientists.

# **Superintendent Search Consultants**

Dr. Melnick explained as a first step in the process of recruiting a search consultant for a new superintendent, he reached out to the best known firms in this area, and those suggested by NYSSBA. He sent out 14 letters to search companies, 6 of which have gone out of business including Goens who did the last search for North Shore; four companies responded. The top one for this area, School Leadership, LLC, is headed by Chuck Fowler, former Superintendent of Nassau BOCES and Hewlett Woodmere. He suggested developing an RFP to be sent to all four firms. In the meantime, he suggested a time line and profile be developed, and for the board to determine how they will involve the community & parents. President Berliner expressed concern that many of these firms conduct searches for several schools at the same time. He said it will be important to know up front that a firm will make our district a priority. The Board will compile a series of questions for the search firms and Dr. Melnick and Ms. Buatsi will develop the RFP with a target date of mid-February for meeting with consulting firms.

#### **Comments from the Public**

Lisa Vizza, Glen Head, asked if the Board plans on an internal review and analysis of the iPad program. She said her experience is that some teachers use the iPad robustly and some teachers do not use it at all. Dr. Melnick responded, he will follow up with the principals however reviewing the iPad program is not one of the goals this year. Trustee Nightingale added, he agrees with Ms. Vizza, not every teacher is using the iPad equally. Ms. Vizza added, Mr. Kaye, Director of Technology, while possibly a hardware specialist, does not seem to be a software specialist and she wondered if the district would consider hiring a K-12 Instructional Software Director. Dr. Melnick responded that would need to be a budget discussion.

Noah Blumenthal, Sea Cliff, suggested adding a course of study on computer coding starting at the elementary level. Dr. Melnick responded there has been some professional development in that area and some outreach with Sea Cliff Makeshop, however there is no formal plan to move in that direction. Mr. Blumenthal asked if there will be community involvement in regard to the search for a new superintendent. President Berliner responded tonight was the first discussion, and the Board is just starting the process. He went on to say there will definitely be community involvement which will be as transparent as possible, and there will be a role for Dr. Melnick in the process as well.
