North Shore Schools Board of Education Regular Meeting Minutes June 16, 2016

The meeting was called to order by President Herman Berliner at 7:00 P.M. in the High School Theatre. Present were Trustees Commander, Gonzalez, Jones, Labbate and Nightingale. Also present Superintendent Dr. Edward Melnick, and Assistant Superintendents Olivia Buatsi and Rob Chlebicki. Trustee Nightingale was not present for Executive Session. Trustee Russo was absent.

At 7:00 pm on motion of Trustee Gonzalez and seconded by Trustee Jones and all in favor, the Board moved to convene an executive session in room H4 to discuss matters leading to the appointment or employment of a particular person or persons, discussions regarding proposed, pending or current litigation, and collective negotiations pursuant to Article 14 of the Civil Service Law (the Taylor Law).

At 7:30 pm on motion of Trustee Labbate and seconded by Trustee Jones and all in favor, the Board moved to come out of executive session and resumed the regular meeting in the high school theatre. There were approximately 100 people in the audience.

### Pledge of Allegiance

President Berliner led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Prior to tenure recognition, Dr. Melnick announced that the North Shore High School has been named a Reward School by New York State. Dr. Melnick recognized high school principal Mr. Albert Cousins for his leadership of the high school and presented Mr. Cousins with a certificate from the state.

### **Approval of Minutes**

On motion of Trustee Commander and seconded by Trustee Jones and all in favor, the minutes of June 2, 2016 were approved.

#### **Regular Business**

### **Policy Review**

Dr. Melnick explained that all policies in the 6000 series were reviewed by both our auditors and district counsel. The sub-committee then reviewed their suggested changes and are recommending those changes be adopted. There were no further changes suggested to the policies in the 6000 series. Dr. Melnick recommended tabling the discussion on policy #1230 (Public Participation at Board Meetings) until the July 5 meeting to give trustees time to review a survey of other Nassau district policies on the same subject. There was consensus on the board to discuss that policy on July 5. In regard to policy #2250 (Board Committees) the only suggested change was to clarify no public participation at sub-committee meetings. Trustee Jones asked for wording which might give the board discretion over when to allow public comments. Dr. Melnick will check with counsel on that possibility. There were no changes to the recommendations on Policy #5050 (Student Gender Identity) or #5420 (Student Health Services).

Trustee Commander read her report from the three (3) meetings she attended of the Athletic Advisory and Policy Committees. She explained that there was overwhelming support on the committees to maintain the policy as stated in the student athlete-parent handbook. Dr. Melnick reminded the Board this is not a board policy, it is an athletic inter-scholastic team policy and should the board decide to make a board policy they would not only be acting against what this committee wants, they would have to change how they interact with all areas of the school program. His recommendation is to leave the policy as is with the understanding that a parent can bring an appeal to the board who has the authority to override the administration at any time. Trustee Commander added, this is not a policy that was just developed. In the review of 2003 there was a concern about consistency, treating each athlete the same and a balance between the individual and the team. Dr. Melnick continued much of what came from the review of 2003 was the discrepancy of what "coaches' discretion" meant from team to team and athlete to athlete. Trustee Jones asked for clarification of the unexcused absences and whether it only applied to JV and Varsity athletes. Trustee Commander responded it does not apply to Middle School athletes, the handbook is a high school handbook. There needs to be a separate discussion about the middle school philosophy. Trustee Gonzalez asked to have the excused and unexcused absences with the consequences in a bulleted format to make it clear to parents what the consequences are.

#### **Comments from the Public**

Steve Grabher, Glen Head, thanked the board for tackling an athletic issue, but he would like to see the superintendent and board work on something other than athletics. He said with the huge amount of money spent in the district he does not understand why there is a need to speak about the athletic program over and over. He commended the middle school program and giving many opportunities to kids but cautioned it may devalue it when it is looked at as an after school activity or babysitting service. He said athletics is more than that, it is competition and our athletic program is one size fits all. He feels in this district parents do not understand being told no.

Tim Madden, Sea Cliff, in regard to the policy on public participation, he suggested changing the language to public comment rather than public participation, as saying no public participation indicates the public is not welcome. In regard to the athletic attendance policy, he went through the handbook

and could not find definitions for excused or unexcused absences so it seems kind of arbitrary. Trustee Commander responded there was a long conversation at one of the meetings and it was decided the only excused absence would be sick or family death. Dr. Melnick explained this will be put in the handbook.

Mr. Madden noted that in executive session there was a discussion on collective bargaining. He realizes the board cannot comment on negotiations, but he would like to know where in the process negotiations stands as he is aware the teachers' contract expires July 1. Dr. Melnick explained that there are future bargaining sessions set up but he cannot comment further than that.

Mr. Madden asked if by reducing the tax levy in action item C would bring us below or at the tax levy limit. Ms. Buatsi responded, it would bring us at the tax levy limit. Mr. Madden asked if the budget transfer of \$500,000 made at the last meeting was done in the 2015-2016 school year or for next year. Dr. Melnick explained it is in the 2015-2016 school year. Finally Mr. Madden noted \$58,000 is being put into the newly established Capital Reserve. He wondered if there will be further funds placed in it as it was anticipated to be somewhere around \$1.5 million. Ms. Buatsi noted once the final audit is completed, it may go a little higher.

Trustee Commander noted at the last meeting Mr. Giordano spoke about the loss of his son to drugs. She expressed her condolences to Mr. Giordano and explained that she recently spoke to a parent who shared with her that her child has lost more peers than she herself has. Trustee Commander would like the board to have as a focus next year the scourge of heroin on our young people. Dr. Melnick suggested a board goal be created around this issue and asked Trustee Commander to help formulate the tasks under the goal.

Trustee Labbate reported on the last LAC meeting of the year. A flyer will be going out next week seeking new members for the committee. They discussed potential areas to focus on next year including the tax cap, APPR, unfunded mandates, voter education, opioid abuse & coalition/parent education. A tentative legislative night has been scheduled for October 5. The board will need to appoint a new chair at the July 5<sup>th</sup> or August 1<sup>st</sup> meeting.

President Berliner asked for a yearly review of security procedures to ensure we are always following best practices. Trustee Labbate responded there are yearly tabletop drills. Dr. Melnick added there is a consultant through BOCES who comes in and reviews our security plans; some can be reported publicly, but some cannot for obvious reasons.

Dr. Melnick as for any suggestions for goals be sent to him prior to the August 1 meeting.
