

## **Title I**

### **Parent Involvement in Student Achievement**

The North Shore School District receives federal funds annually through Title I of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, to support student achievement for students who are at risk for not meeting state academic requirements.

The Board of Education endorses parent involvement in the use of these funds for academic intervention support and programs. Parents of students who are eligible for Title I services (those who are at risk for not meeting state academic requirements) are encouraged to contact their principal or Assistant Superintendent Robert Chlebicki at 227-7810 to discuss the planned use of Title I funds. The plan for Title I funds is submitted by August 31 of each school year.
