

- Exams are 45 minutes
- Exams are administered online on any device
- Check MyAP.collegeboard.org to see which exams you are registered for
  - The dates and times are listed later in this presentation, and are **not** up to date on the AP

Registration for AP exams is closed. No new registrations will be taken.



At-home exam simulation will be available for students.




AP LANG, AP LIT, APUSH, AP EURO, and WHAP will be ONE 45-minute essay.



APUSH, WHAP, and AP EURO will be a FIVE-document DBQ.

## How to Access Your AP Exam

- Ensure you can log in to <a href="https://myap.collegeboard.org/login">https://myap.collegeboard.org/login</a> at least a week before the test date
  - Coordinators and teachers do not have access to student usernames and passwords
  - Check which email you have on file for communication from College Board
  - Secure browser is not needed
- You will receive a code to access the exam.
  - Verify which email address is on file
- Be sure your device is charged up, internet is on
- Log on 30 minutes prior to the exam, refresh if needed when it's time to begin

## Critical Information

- Students that have previously been approved for testing accommodations will have automatic access.
  - Students with extended time will have this automatically.

#### Timing

- A timer will appear on the screen so that students know how much time they have remaining.
- This clock can be hidden, if preferred. However students must keep track of their own time.
- Items not submitted by the end of the time will not be able to be scored.

## Critical Information

- Questions can only be answered in the time allotted, which varies for each exam
  - Section I
  - Upload- 5 minutes
  - Section II
  - Upload- 5 minutes
- The student needs to submit on the same device that they retrieve the exam
- Students can hand-write and upload a photo or type and copy/paste
  - Help students decide which is best for your subject area
  - If you take a photo, you will have to email it to yourself and retrieve on the device for submission- within the allotted time

## Course Specific Exam Information

- Course Specific Exam Information
  - Most exams will be a 25-minute free response question with 5 minutes to upload, followed by a 15-minute free response question
- Students will not get an AB subscore for BC Calc this year
  - Students cannot take both AB and BC
  - Students can switch over if they want to by April 20th
- Courses with standard rubrics
  - Rubrics will be revised and adjusted to the task

# Course Specific Exam Information

- Language acquisition
  - Mic- students need to be able to speak as the device records
  - Paper and pen/pencil to take notes on the directions and prepare for the tasks
  - No reading/writing
  - Exam security (voice)
- English Language & Composition will have rhetorical analysis question
- English Literature & Composition will have prose fiction question
- History exams: DBQ based on 5 documents, rather than 7
- Computer Science A students may use an IDE or compiler if they choose, but it is not required
- Biology will focus on questions 1 & 4

## Course Specific Exam Information

- AP Art (Drawing, 2D), and AP Computer Science Principles are portfolios only
  - Students must access the Digital Portfolio Submission platform and upload their work there
  - Talk to your teacher or the AP Coordinator for deadlines and support

#### Statistics

Students may need to access the Formula Sheet and should access and/or print it before

#### Calculators

- Graphic calculators are not necessary for Calculus or Statistics (but may be used)
  - Students can use whatever they want, and have to provide their own
- Let us know if you need a calculator

# Course Specific Information

#### Chemistry

- students will require access to the Periodic Table of Elements and the AP Chemistry
  Equations and Physical Constants sheet, and should access and/or print before the exam.
  May also want a calculator.

#### Physics 1/2/C

- Print or have access to the appropriate formula sheet
  - Physics 1
  - Physics C
- May also want a calculator.

# **Testing Security**

- Students may consult texts, notes, resources, but not another test taker.
  - Questions and formats are designed to be open-ended, not from content that can be found in textbooks or online
  - There is a limited amount of time
- Students may not consult with another student answering the test questions
  - o "Don't set yourself up to fail in college, accurately measure your own knowledge."
- Non-confidential measures
  - Series of pre-exam questions and introductory steps against imposter detection/fraud
  - The way a student writes, patterns in which they type
  - Plagiarism software

# **Testing Security**

- Consequences will be severe
  - "Even students that <u>plan</u> to cheat will be reported to every college and university to which they have reported PSAT, SAT, and AP scores."
- At a minimum, students should understand that those attempting to gain an unfair advantage will either be blocked from testing or their AP scores will be canceled, and their high school will be notified
- Students may be prohibited from taking a future AP exam, as well as the SAT, SAT Subject Tests, or CLEP assessments
- More on security

## After the Exam

- Teachers will get their student's responses to their official AP Exams no later than May 26th
- Another measure to ensure testing security
- Use the exam as a tool to inform instruction.

# Scoring

- Readings will double
  - Not face to face this year, all at home scoring
  - 19/38 exams already have at home scoring
- Scores will still be 1-5
- Scores will be released as close to the usual early July timeframe as possible
- More on scores
- Membership association/higher education
  - Virtually every 4 year college is a member and is in regular communication with the College Board
