GOAL One

Critical Analysis of Instructional Program

- Review progress on goals related to year one of the North Shore Journey (strategic plan framework) in conjunction with the Tri-State Consortium review of the North Shore Journey in spring 2025.
- Continue to analyze the impact of information based technologies on our students, inside and outside of school.
- Engage faculty in an exploration of the principles and practice of authentic learning.
- In an ongoing effort to review district programs on a regular basis, evaluate:
 - Special Education, Pre-K-12 (follow up)
 - o Advanced Programs (follow up)
 - Math and Science (new review)

GOAL Two

Strategic Capital, Financial and Systems Planning

- Explore ways to mitigate financial challenges caused by the possible major loss of revenue in 2027-28 from the potential expiration of the power supply agreement on LIPA properties.
 - Review comparative lenses and expert advice to outline possible budgetary decisions that would help the District to prepare for revenue loss.
 - Continue to seek new short-term and long-term revenue sources including grants, sustainable
 revenues from New York State and the Federal government, and the development of tuitionbased programs and other forms of revenue generation through community collaboration.
- Develop a plan to address and prioritize capital project needs through collaboration with all representative stakeholder groups in the District and community.
- Resume regular Board of Education policy review of the 1000-2000 series as well as pertinent policies of current importance.

GOAL Three

Community Outreach with a focus on Community Engagement

- Create new opportunities for diverse groups of employees, students, alumni, and community members to engage in dialogue with the Board of Education, District Administration and each other.
- Illustrate and share the unique story of the North Shore experience of students in innovative ways to a variety of audiences.
- Strengthen the District's relationship networks in the community, including business groups, civics organizations, young parents, new residents, and legislative leaders.
