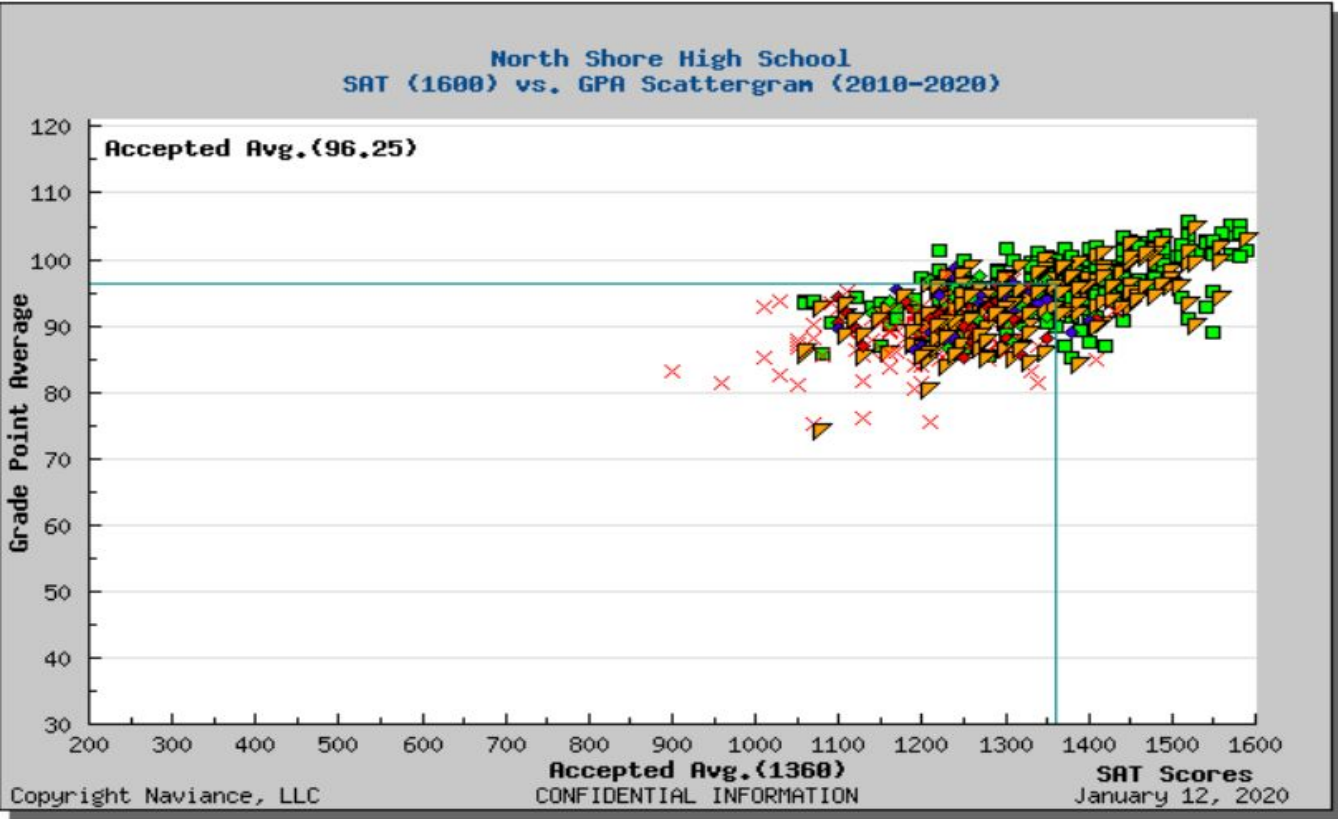
Start Early
