Regular Meeting
Minutes
October 27, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President David Ludmar at 6:30 p.m. in the Glenwood Landing Elementary School Auditorium. Present were Trustees Cashman, Colacioppo, Galati, Macari, Mosca and Russo. Also present were Superintendent Dr. Christopher Zublionis and Assistant Superintendents Dr. Carol Smyth and Mr. James Pappas.

At 6:30 p.m., on motion of Trustee Colacioppo and seconded by Trustee Mosca and all in favor, the Board convened an executive session in room 101 to consider matters regarding the appointment or employment of a particular person or persons, proposed, pending or current litigation and collective negotiations pursuant to Article 14 of the Civil Service Law (the Taylor Law).

At 7:45 p.m. on motion of Trustee Cashman and seconded by Trustee Galati and all in favor, the Board came out of executive session and resumed the regular meeting in the auditorium. There were approximate 75 people in the audience.

### **Pledge of Allegiance**

President Ludmar led the public in the pledge of allegiance.

President Ludmar explained that the Board held their annual retreat recently and as a result of their work with a parliamentarian, there will be changes to some of the procedures reflected in the meeting tonight.

## **Board of Education Recognition**

Dr. Zublionis read a Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition from Congressman Thomas Suozzi on the occasion of School Board Recognition Week thanking the Board of Education for their "devotion to our students" and offering "best wishes for continued success in improving education for our future generations". He then introduced Natasha Gordon and Courtney Chambers, the copresidents of Coordinating Council of Parent Organizations for the District. On behalf of the parent organizations of the five schools in the district, Ms. Gordon and Ms. Chambers recognized the members of the Board of Education. To honor the members of the Board, a selection of music was performed by the North Shore High School Jazz Quartet by students, Sophie Brandimarte, Wade Livingston, Ruben Shonick, and Will Winchester, led by Band teacher Brandon Bromsey. This was followed by presentations of gifts representative of each of the five schools in the district by their principal, parent organization reps and students.

On behalf of the Board, President Ludmar thanked the students, the principals, the parents and the community.

### **Approval of Minutes**

The reading of the draft minutes of the meeting of October 13, 2022, being prepared and disseminated to all members in advance of the meeting, was dispensed. There being no corrections to the minutes, it was declared by President Ludmar that the minutes of October 13, 2022 were approved.

## Report from the Co-Presidents of the SGO

SGO co-president Michael Fleming reported on events and activities at the high school including: the SGO will be holding a Halloween costume contest; teachers will nominate students for different categories and the winners will be announced at Super Commons on Wednesday. Spirit Day is scheduled for November 4 and the theme is Hawaiian Day.

# **Report of the Superintendent**

Dr. Zublionis thanked the Board of Education for all they do for the students of North Shore. He thanked the parent organizations, which he said have been so collaborative this year, and principals for organizing Board Recognition this evening.

Dr. Zublionis reported that over 100 students were inducted into the National Honor Society. He thanked Dr. Kirmser and the officers for organizing that event. The Middle School Culture Club Fair celebrated Mexico and Central America and he thanked Ms. Haleiko for organizing that event. He reported that Halloween events are starting this week with a Middle School Social on Friday, parades at all elementary schools will be held on Monday as well as costume contests at the middle school and one sponsored by the SGO at the high school.

Dr. Zublionis congratulated the women's varsity swim team on their strong finish and the women's soccer team on their great season. He noted the upcoming playoff games for varsity boys and girls cross country; varsity field hockey; varsity volleyball and varsity football.

Dr. Zublionis recognized salutatorian Rubin Shonik. He shared that he has known Ruben since the second grade and said he is a significant example of the North Shore Journey. He also congratulated the valedictorian, Ava Bartoli, and pointed out how Ruben's North Shore Journey lead him to music and Ava's led her to athletics and both with academic success.

Dr. Zublionis recognized the special events held throughout the district over the last weeks. Unity Day was held on October 19 in all schools. This is an annual event held every October to promote healthier communities by joining together to unite for kindness, acceptance and inclusion which was started by Pacer's National Bullying Prevention Center in 2011. It is now celebrated throughout the world. North Shore celebrated with themed events and wearing orange. He thanked Mr. Dan Doherty, the social workers and counselors for all their efforts in bringing this event here. He said it is fully embraced by our faculty, administration, and families. He further stated that although it is only one day, it is symbolic and inspiring. Red Ribbon week was held all this week and the work of Mr. Doherty and the social workers was seen throughout the schools through programs organized to promote commitment to self, healthy decisions leading a drug-free life, and empowering ourselves. He also thanked Ms. Alison Camardella and Mr. Kevin McGilloway of CASA for their good work with the schools, especially during Red Ribbon Week, and their work with youth in our community. In addition, they are partnering to bring in Chris Herren to North Shore on Feb 15. Dr. Zublionis said he has an amazing story, has been featured on 30 for 30 and has done powerful presentations at other school districts.

Dr. Zublionis reported that "listening sessions" will begin next week. These are connected to the strategic plan and North Shore Journey. This is an opportunity for he and Dr. Smyth and other school leaders to listen. There will be three cycles for each quadrant of the North Shore Journey with two sessions each, one in the evening and one in the morning. The first session will be on November 2 & 3

regarding Meaningful Learning & Academic Mastery; the second on November 8 & 10 regarding Positive Relationships; the third on November 28 & December 1 on Participation in Interest Based Electives and Extra-Curricular Activities; and the last on December 8 on Wellness. On November 9, there will be a Parent University dedicated to the Ruler Program; this will be facilitated by Ms. Bridget Finder, Principal of Glenwood Landing School as well as Mr. Dan Doherty, Director of Counseling.

## Comments from the Public-9:00 p.m.

Prior to opening the floor to comments from the public, President Ludmar explained that the Board is not required to hold a public comments period, however they do feel it is important to hear from the community and to give attendees the right to speak. They encourage attendance at their meetings. He went on to say that at the last meeting it was a great example of what public comments is about. Members who spoke were clear, respectful and the Board heard and learned from them. He further remarked that this is a great format to hear from members of the community and to get their perspective, which is invaluable. He pointed out that as noted in the Board's policy, and on the agenda, the naming of students and staff is not permitted. He asked that the public now apply this practice to Trustees and not name individual Trustees but keep things general and address the comment to the Board as a whole.

Joanna Clancy, Glen Head, asked that the Board continue to look at changing the tutoring policy as she believes it hurts athletes and teams. She said she agrees there should not be one-on-one coaching, but does not believe the policy as it stands, is a good fit for athletes. Ms. Clancy also asked that the Board look at replacing the athletic fields. She said safety should be the first and foremost priority.

Lisa Vizza, Glen Head, suggested reaching out to seniors in the community when concert season comes around so they can come out and enjoy the amazing performances by our students.

Mike Conklin, Greenvale, asked about the status of the electronic sign. Dr. Zublionis explained that they were hoping they could use the vendor they had been working with as a sole source, however because of the cost, it was determined they needed to do an RFP (request for proposals). Once this is done, a bid will take place, there will need to be a contract, and SED approval will also have to take place. This has added to the length of the timeline for installing the sign.

Chris Wolf, Glen Head, North Shore Athletic Advocates and Booster Club Board Member, said he has heard there are concerns about replacing the turf field with turf, due to safety issues, and there are discussions about possibly replacing it with grass. He said in his opinion it would be more costly to replace the turf with grass. He also commented that there may be a segment of the community that will find reasons not to move forward. He asked the Board not to delay in proceeding with the turf field. President Ludmar explained that rumors always happen in the community, it has happened before, it is important to get the facts from the Board. Dr. Zublionis added he is not sure where that information came from. He knows several years ago there was a health issue brought up with rubber in playgrounds. He understands the issues with a grass field. He also explained that the middle school softball field was just done with grass through grant money.

Tessie Toppol, Sea Cliff, thanked the Board for all they do, and she appreciates their public recognition. She asked that Dr. Zublionis share how they measure the success of Unity Day, and maintain the outcomes, when it seems the daily issues being faced would take more than a day to deal with. Dr. Zublionis explained the SEL (social-emotional learning) program, days like Unity Day and Red Ribbon Week, having speakers come, collecting more data of how children feel about school are all ways they

are seeing what transfers to students. They have just begun listening sessions, there will be more formal surveys, ongoing measurement, to find the best way to measure progress.

Prior to approval, President Ludmar recognized the retirement of Robert McKee, School Psychologist and thanked him for his many years of service to the students of North Shore. He noted that although his retirement was being accepted tonight, he would be continuing in his position until the end of the school year.

Dr. Zublionis remarked that Mr. McKee has been a School Psychologist since 2001 and has been at the middle school for many years, always thinking of ways to make the middle school student life better for all kids.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the North Shore Central School District hereby approves the Agreement between the School District and the Roslyn Union Free School District for Special Education Services for parentally placed students with disabilities attending non-public schools located within the North Shore Central School District and residing within the Roslyn Union Free School District during the 2022-2023 school year

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the President of the Board of Education to execute the necessary documents to effectuate said Agreement on behalf of the Board of Education.

#### Unfinished Business - 9:23 p.m.

Trustee Macari asked for an update on the Pre-K program. She asked when we might lose the grant money if the program is not instituted. Dr. Zublionis explained that he has been reaching out to the local pre-k programs in our area and they charge so far above what the state is giving us per child that they do not want to partner with us. What the state is giving us is an average between down state and upstate. He explained that some districts are partnering with parochial schools, which he is now looking into. Another option is partnering with Scope or another agency, to operate a program within our schools, but that would require finding space in our schools. He has received an extension from the state on the funds into December. Dr. Zublionis will continue to update the Board as he receives further information.

### **New Business**

Trustee Mosca explained that earlier this year the State Legislature moved forward with the plan that LIPA be transformed to a municipal utility, which they say will be more beneficial for rate payers. There is supposed to be a plan by February 1 and to the Legislature by April 1. She said it is an evolving situation and we do not know yet how it would affect the District, given our situation with LIPA. She asked if this should be something for LAC to pursue. President Ludmar asked that LAC monitor the situation to see where it goes.

President Ludmar asked if students who earn credit through Nassau Community College classes in the dual enrollment program, will be able to transfer those credits to other institutions, the same as those who attend Nassau as college students. Dr. Smyth explained that Dr. Titone has done an amazing job putting together the dual enrollment opportunities, which are growing. She further explained that students will get a transcript from those colleges, and credits will be transferable.
